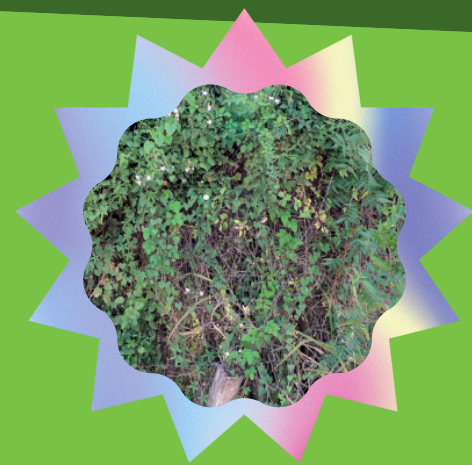
FLUMINENSE VELL

Jasminum fluminense Vell known as Brazilian jasmine, Gold coast jasmine or jasmine is native to tropical Africa and the Arabian Peninsula.



Jasminum Fluminense vell was first introduced as an ornamental plant. It began to invade pastures, croplands, urban open space, disturbed areas, roadsides, forest edges/gaps and riverbanks.

J.fluminense Vell is known to smother vegetation including native plant species.



J.fluminense vell can lead to the collapse of native plant communities.

J.fluminense vell is known to climb high into tree canopies, it shades out herbs, shrubs, and trees in the understorey of native forests.



J.fluminense Vell is present in most Caribbean islands but only recorded as invasive on Cuba, Dominican Republic, and Puerto Rico
