The green iguana is also known as Iguana iguana is a species native to Central America, the tropical parts of South America, and some eastern Caribbean islands.

The green iguana is a popular pet but the escape or deliberate release of unwanted pet iguanas is how they were introduced outside their native range.







The green iguanas have been known to cause damage to infrastructure by collapsing sidewalks and digging burros that erode and collapse sidewalks, berms, canal banks, and seawalls.

The green iguana is currently present in Mexico (Sinaloa and Veracruz) south to Paraguay and southeastern Brazil. It is also found on numerous continental islands, including Cozumel, San Andrés, and Providencia, Roatán, Utila, Cayo Icacos, Trinidad and Tobago. It is believed to be native on some eastern Caribbean islands: Grenada, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Saint Lucia, Montserrat and Saba.
